The purpose of the Internal Affairs Division is to ensure the integrity of the Police Department and its officers. Complaints are investigated objectively and fairly while preserving the rights of all involved. Internal Affairs' objectives include protection of the public, protection of the Department, protection of the employee, removal of unfit personnel, and correction of procedural problems. In 2016, the Professional Standards Division investigated seven (7) Internal Affairs reviews and one hundred and twenty three (123) administrative reviews.
